Lukasewicz: Spoke to Dominick Cerase at the Lackawanna River Sewage Treatment Facilities because I was concerned about the possibility of waste water coming into the sewage treatment plant down there. Hasn't come in there yet and is reluctant because doesn't want it to go over the roads. Tom pointed out to him a sign that has been up for several months Dickson City Transload Facility. Looking into if going to use the railroads to start bringing in the waste that is going to Keystone and may possibly use this to bring the water waster to the sewage treatment plant. It has been retrofitted over the last 3 years. Added facilities. My concern was is there a possibility of that waste coming here because it was retrofitted. At this point there has been no discussion of it. The waste has been going to 15 sites for sewage disposal in Pennsylvania but they stopped to this so the industry needs somewhere to take the waste. In the past several weeks there has been a lot of discussion between the authority and the drilling industry to start bringing it to the facility in Forest City. The railroad tracks come right to the gate of the sewage treatment facility. They would have to extend it only about 300 feet.

Lukasewicz also spoke of his landfill tour.
