

ORDINANCE NUMBER 9 OF 2006

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 21 OF 1998
TO INCORPORATE PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO INSTALL CONCRETE SIDEWALKS
FOLLOWING NEW CONSTRUCTION**

WHEREAS, Throop Borough Council adopted Ordinance Number 21 of 1998 requiring the installation of concrete sidewalks following new construction; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance Number 21 of 1998 failed to include any penalties for failure to comply with said ordinance


NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Throop that Ordinance Number 21 of 1998 is amended to incorporate penalties for non compliance in that any person, partnership, firm or corporation who fails, neglects and/or refuses to comply with the provisions of Ordinance #14 of 1998 shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$300.00 plus costs of prosecution, including reasonable attorney fees and that for each ten (10) days that a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 1. If any section, clause, provision or portion of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of this Ordinance so long as it remains legally enforceable minus the invalid portion. The Borough of Throop reserves the right to amend this Ordinance or any portion thereof from time to time as it shall deem advisable in the best interests of the promotion of the purposes and intent of this Ordinance and the effective administration thereof.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is enacted by the Council of the Borough of Throop under the authority of the Act of the Legislative, as amended, December 12, 1990, P.L. 1994, No. 220, and any other applicable law arising under the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
