

**A PROCLAMATION BY THE MAYOR
OF THE BOROUGH OF THROOP, PENNSYLVANIA
DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN THROOP BOROUGH**

Pursuant to Pennsylvania Borough Code §10A06 and additional powers granted to Mayors relating to emergency management services, Mayor Joseph Tropiak hereby proclaims and declares a **State of Emergency** due to the public health emergency related to the potential spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) that exists in the United States of America, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Throop Borough.


AND FURTHERMORE, I do, hereby restrict public access to the following properties until further notice:

1. Throop Borough Building, 436 Sanderson Street, Throop, PA 18512, 570-489-8311. Throop Borough Government will continue normal operations. Any resident who needs to conduct borough business with the Borough Manager, Treasurer, Secretary, Zoning and Code Enforcement Officer, Street Commissioner and Tax Collector please call 570-489-8311 to make arrangements. Throop Borough Taxes can ONLY be mailed. Please make check or money order payable to Adam Nosak and mail payment to 436 Sanderson Street, Throop, PA 18512. If you need a receipt, please provide a self-addressed stamped envelope. Until further notice all business will be done by phone or email if feasible.
2. Throop Civic Center / Senior Center, 500 Sanderson Street, Throop, PA 18512, 570-383-7906. Access was and remains restricted to all activities with the exception of Day Care.
3. All Borough parks will be locked shut and access restricted immediately. If a park is unable to be physically locked the restriction still applies. Anyone found in a Throop Borough Park during the **STATE OF EMERGENCY** will be charged with trespassing.
4. Throop Borough Police Department, 201 Charles Street, Throop, PA 18512, 570-489-0211, shall remain open to public access, however, you are encouraged to refrain from accessing the building unless absolutely necessary. If you have an emergency and need a police officer call 911. Otherwise for non-emergencies or copies of police reports call 570-489-0211 or email Chief Kerecman at kerecmana@throopboro.com.
5. Department of Public Works, 100 Hall Street, Throop, PA 18512, 570-489-2937 then follow prompts, will remain open and performing necessary functions. For all issues regarding sewers, garbage collection, streets, and parks please call 570-489-8311 or email the Street Commissioner, Robert Kalinoski at rkalinoski@throopboro.com.

AND FURTHERMORE, I urge all residents, businesses, organizations and visitors to abide during the period of this **STATE OF EMERGENCY** by recommendations made by the Center for Disease Control, as well as guidance issued by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Pennsylvania Department of Health, and to refrain from all nonessential travel, gatherings, and business so as to mitigate the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and, in turn this public health emergency.

AND FURTHERMORE, this Declaration of Emergency shall remain in effect until rescinded or extended.
